## Grade 11 Course Selections - TDChristian High School

## Instructions and Course Options for 2024-25

As a grade 10 student, you need to complete your Grade 11 course selections for next year. Please read and follow the instructions carefully and in complete them in order.

Grade 11 students need three compulsory credits (English, Math, and Bible), and five elective courses. We recommend you take a science or tech course as an elective as this provides you with more options for college and university.

1) Log-in to your My Blueprint account.
2) From the Home page, click on "High School" to see the Course Selections window.
3) Add courses to your High School Plan.

Courses you have completed and/or are currently taking should be listed under your grade 9 and 10 columns.
a. Under the Grade 11 column, click on a compulsory course to select a course for that subject, and click on the appropriate course.
i. This will take you to the Course Information page where you will see the course description and prerequisite requirements.
ii. If you do not have the prerequisite course or mark for the selected course, you will be given a warning. In this case you need to pick another course level ( $\mathrm{U}, \mathrm{M}, \mathrm{C}$, or O ).
iii. If there are no warnings, click "Add Course."
b. Repeat step a. above until all three compulsory subject courses are full.
c. See the back of this page to determine your Elective and Alternate courses: fill in choices 1 to 9 .
d. For your Elective courses, in myBlueprint, start with your first choice. Repeat the steps i. to v. below until elective courses are completed (for most students, choices 1 to 5).
i. Click on the course.
ii. Filter by grade.
iii. Select a discipline to view the courses available under each.
iv. Select a course to view the course description and prerequisites. If an application is required, links to the application form can be found on this Course Information page.
v. Click "Add Course" if you wish to select and there are no warning messages.
e. For Alternate Courses (usually choices 6 to 9 ), courses that you may get if there are conflicts with any of your elective courses or some of them do not run, click on Alternate Course.
i. Repeat steps i. to v. in part d. (above) until all alternate courses are full.
ii. Be sure your Alternate Courses are listed in order of preference.
4) Make sure you have $\mathbf{1 2}$ courses selected for next year. Your ideal timetable of eight courses should be listed in the top section, with your four alternate courses, in order of preference, at the bottom.
5) Once you have selected all your courses, click "Review Course Selections". Make sure there are no issues listed with any of your selections. If there are, go back and edit the necessary course(s) by selecting a different course or level (open, workplace, college, university, or university/college (M))
6) When you are confident, click "Submit Course Selections." Once you click submit, you will be locked out of course selections and will not be able to change your selections on your own.
7) Click "Print Sign-Off Sheet." Read and print the sign-off sheet. This sheet needs to be signed by you, a parent/guardian, and, if course permission is required, also by that teacher.
8) Submit the Sign-Off Sheet to the office by 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, February 29. Note that your course selections are not complete until the Sign-off sheet and any necessary applications are in the office.
9) If you wish to make any changes to your course selections once your sheet is submitted, you will need to do so through your guidance counsellor or by having your parent or guardian email schedules@tdchristian.ca.
