Dear Student,

Are you interested in learning in another country in a very different and powerful way? If you are, check out our International Block program information. This letter in printed form includes what you need to assist you in the decision-making process.

Embarking on an international trip as part of International Block provides opportunities that cannot be matched elsewhere. It will be a challenging experience; but, such experiences are often the most rewarding. If you are chosen, International Block will likely stretch you socially, spiritually, physically, and culturally (i.e. living in ways most unlike home). Communicating using another language will be part of it. However, you will come away knowing more about yourself, society, your beliefs, and the world than could be learned in many other places.

The International Block offers a fantastic opportunity to engage in a new learning environment, experience a completely new culture, and learn some Spanish. In addition, you will be challenged to work with and trust others in group situations.

As done in 2018-19 and 2019-20, we are partnering with other Christian high schools and EduDeo. We expect that the classes for this program (for Grades 11 and 12) will be English and Perspectives.

Consider the information about International Block carefully. If you can, connect with students who have taken part in the program in the past. Show these sheets to your parents or guardians. Talk to them, pray about it.

If you have any further questions, please speak to Mr. Groot, in person or contact him by e-mail. He can also put you into contact with Ms. Laurie Koning, the School Relationship Manager at EduDeo.

Learning for service in the light of God's word.

Serve with an attitude of walking alongside the stranger with an expectation of learning from the stranger.

Who? Students who will be at least 16 years old before January 1, 2022. They must be patient, driven, flexible, and be able to take risks. They must be willing to be stretched physically, emotionally, and spiritually. At the same time, they must be able to work independently and in a team for the semester. Finally, students must have the drive and means to raise funds.

What? This Block will include four courses in second semester (English, Perspectives and two co-op credits, though in special circumstances, alternative or extra courses may be taken) or two courses in the fourth quadmester (two co-op credits or one co-op credit and an Interdisciplinary course). Students will prepare for service, learn some Spanish, research cultural norms and customs, compare social institutions in Canadian society to those in Central America, and develop group cohesion and teamwork skills possibly with counterparts from other Christian high schools such as London, Smithville, Hamilton, Chatham, and Quinte. Class time after the trip will be used to debrief, work on summative assignments or projects to complete course work.

When? The proposed time for the six-week trip is early April to mid-May 2022 (tentative).

Where? Students will work and serve in Central America where we have been since 2009-10. The plan for 2021 is to be based at the Nehemiah Center in Managua, Nicaragua working with EduDeo and its partner Christian schools (ACECEN). More information will be available during the Course Selections process. Our objective is to ensure students have a safe and varied service and cultural experience. Students will volunteer in schools (hopefully, as student assistants) and orphanages, visit significant Nicaraguan sites (hopefully, with Nicaraguan students), and complete construction tasks.

Costs? School tuition remains the same. However, students need to raise funds for their team of around \$6,000. The International Block 2020 team page is found at edudeo.com/hands/internationalblock2020/. In 2019-20, ten students from London and TDChristian made up the group – though, in the end, the pandemic prevented the group from going to Nicaragua. The funds cover the cost of the trip except for things such as personal toiletries, spending money, vaccinations, passport, health insurance and health coverage. A \$500 deposit in the form of a post-dated cheque is required to indicate a student's commitment to entering this program and will be forwarded to EduDeo once the student is accepted into the Block. Cheques will be returned to those who are not selected. Families who have concerns about finances, should contact Ms. Rosie at rosie@tdchristian.ca. We do not wish to turn down students solely on the basis of money.

Chaperones: The plan is for the group to be led by Henry and Yvonne Lammers, a teacher and a social worker. Depending on the group's size additional chaperones may be sent.

Anticipated Steps:

- **#1.** Students should bring the signed **International Block Application Form** to Marg in the office along with their course selection sheets. Students who wish to be considered for the program should attach a \$500 cheque made out to TDChristian High School (post-dated **June 1**), make sure they fill in the questionnaire portion of the form, and write one to two pages detailing why they want to go, what they think they will learn, and what they could offer to the Block class. How it is written is not as important as what is written.
- **#2.** Based on the writings, teachers' input, students' abilities to work in and out of class, and overall school behaviour students will be invited to an interview in late May or early June (via EduDeo) with Mr. and Mrs. Lammers.
- **#3.** Interviewed students will be informed whether or not they have been accepted, likely, by mid-June. At that time, they will have the opportunity to accept or reject the offer.
